# II. SCOPE OF PRODUCTS (IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE NOTIFYING MEMBER'S CLASSIFICATION OF PRODUCTS)

(a) Number (tariff lines) and list of eligible products:

Number of tariff lines eligible for GPT treatment:

The GPT applies to most goods, except for certain agricultural goods, textiles, apparel, footwear and some specialty steel. The number of actual tariff lines fluctuates as the *Customs Tariff* is updated; however, the coverage does not change. As of 31 March 2016, the GPT covers 5969 tariff lines of a total 7282 lines, or 82.0% of lines.

Number of tariff lines eligible for LDCT treatment: the LDCT applies to all goods except for over-access, supply-managed agricultural goods. The number of actual tariff lines fluctuates as the *Customs Tariff* is updated; however, the coverage does not change. As of 31 March 2016, the LDCT covers 7181 tariff lines of a total 7282 lines, or 98.6% of lines.
